EXHIBITS

Riverviews Artspace presents regional, national, and internationally recognized artists working in a variety of mediums.

In 2021, we featured 81 artists across 18 exhibitions – including 8 emerging artists. Throughout the year, the gallery sold 44 original pieces of artwork from various exhibits.

For the first half of 2021, exhibits were available online, in order to continue our mission of making contemporary art accessible to all while still ensuring we do our part to maintain the health of our community.

Exhibit hours are extended on the first Friday of every month, thus dubbed "First Fridays", offering the public another opportunity to access Contemporary Art. During these events, our in-house studio artists allow guests into their studios offering visitors an opportunity to experience the art, the workspace, and to engage the artists.




